Boston's Old North Church was established in 1723 and is an historic landmark and active Episcopal Church. It is the oldest standing church building nestled in the beautiful historic North End. The church is mostly known for its' role in Paul Revere's midnight ride and for the signal lanterns hung in the steeple in 1775 which alerted the patriots of the British troops approaching Lexington & Concorde which was the very beginning of the American Revolution.

Visitors can delve into the church's rich history and explore its scenic courtyard. You'll also discover the captivating story of Paul Revere and view the church's 1759 organ. Depending on availability, a visit to the crypt may also be possible. As one of the most frequented sites on the Freedom Trail, Old North Church offers a profound way to honor history and appreciate its impact on our nation.
