MONMOUTH BATTLEFIELD - A PRIVATE EXPERIENCE WITH HISTORIAN

Monmouth Battlefield is a key site in American Revolutionary War history that should not be missed. In June 1778, one of the longest battles of the Revolutionary War was fought here among the beautiful fields and forests. Today, the land is a preserved state park that welcomes visitors year-round. It features miles of hiking and horse-riding trails, picnic areas, a visitors' center, and a restored Revolutionary War farmhouse.

You will tour the battlefield with a specialized guide to get a sense of the land and teach you about the events that took place here nearly 250 years ago. The tour includes visits to landmarks and significant points on the battlefield, as well as a colonial church and the old courthouse. A visit to the museum and the gift shop is also part of the experience.

There are options to tailor the tour to special interests, such as the story of Molly Pitcher—her actions during the Battle of Monmouth and her role as a symbol of female courage during the American Revolution. Alternatively, you can learn more about General George Washington's role as a field commander.

Touring the battlefield is a great way of immersing in history and to understand the events that took place that helped shaping our nation.
