VALLEY FORGE - ENCAMPMENT TOUR

Valley Forge National Historical Park is the site of a Revolutionary War encampment, northwest of Philadelphia. It served as the winter encampment General George Washington and the Continental Army. The park trails connect the key monuments and historic structures, including the early-20th-century National Memorial Arch and the Muhlenberg Brigade the recreated log-cabin barracks used by General Peter Muhlenberg and his men. This offers the a great opportunity to learn what life was like at the campsite and the daily tasks those staying there were faced with. You will also visit Isaac Potts House - known today as Washington's Headquarter as the structure was used by General Washington at the time. Visitors will also Grand Parade Ground which is the area where the Continental Soldiers drilled and marched.

Valley Forge brings history to life in a beautiful setting, providing ample opportunities to learn and explore. Guests can tour the park with a specialized guide, gaining a deeper understanding of the area's history and its role in shaping America.
